Happy 100th Birthday!

Congratulations to long time Riverton resident, Vera Hannaford, Who recently celebrated her 100th birthday.

Celebrations for the significant milestone began on Christmas Day, at the family

farm Vera and her late husband, Claude, ran, when Vera was surrounded by her family of 4 children, 9 grandchildren and 15 great grandchildren.

On her actual birthday, close friends and immediate family who live nearby enjoyed afternoon tea (complete with a crayfish) at Vera's son, Alfie's, Art Gallery. Pub Squash, not champagne, was Vera's drink for the day. "You learn to do as you are told as you get older," Vera said. Celebrations included a delicious numeral 100 cake (with each number being a different flavour).

Vera received official congratulatory letters and birthday cards, including one from the queen and governor general. However, her favourite was a card from the Port Adelaide (Power) Football Club.

Born in Adelaide, Vera was brought up in Bute and attended Bute Primary and then Kadina High School. She worked as a telephonist before training as a nurse at Riverton. Vera said, "Back then, the hospital had everything – surgery, midwifery, contagious diseases, etc. People came from everywhere to train there." Vera nursed for 2 years before she married her sweetheart, Claude. As was the norm back then, Vera retired from nursing and, with her usual enthusiasm, took up helping on the

farm and raising her family. "I loved the farm life – even though we didn't have any power – it was hard work, but we managed. We had to take our babies to the baby train to get them weighed. Like my mother, I made all the children's clothes until they got older – up until the boys' clothes needed buttons, buttonholes and zips- I wasn't very good at that."

Over the years, Vera was involved in setting up the local kindy and was involved with the primary school and CWA. She played hockey, tennis, netball and acrobatic dancing as a child, and later moved on to yoga and lawn bowls, playing the latter until she was in her 90's. While her sporting days are over, Vera loves watching sport on television.

Vera says that keeping active through sports and walking, plus volunteering her time in Riverton, have perhaps been the key to her longevity.

TORRENS ROAD BEAUTIFICATION PROJECT

The latest stage of the Council's Riverton Footpath Project has continued, with the section of footpath in front of the Museum, down as far as the Post Office, being replaced.

Included as part of the Footpath Project, was the installation of wheelchair access from the footpath to the Scholz Park Cottage verandah, the removal of existing footpath plinths, and the gradual levelling of the lawn area down to the new footpath. Some minor tasks still await completion.



Scholz Park Museum

Following discussions with Clare & Gilbert Valleys Council and Heritage SA over the past year, approval has been received for Scholz Park Museum to embark upon Stage 2 of its Museum Restoration Project.



Costing \$32,000, the Project is fully funded with contributions from both the Grand Lodge and the Clare & Gilbert Valleys Council.

Some of the Project work already completed include: (a) replacing the Wheelwright Shop roof, (b) replacing the Cottage Roof, and restoration of the Cottage walls.

Commencing shortly will be the re-painting of the Cottage interior. Several more aspects of the Project are scheduled for the next month or so.



In other news, a Freemason Exhibition of artifacts from the former Wooroora Freemason Lodge, which closed its door in September 2016, will be housed in the

Cottage. An official opening for the Exhibition will be arranged in coming months.
