#### **ANZ BANK CLOSES**

The ANZ (originally ES&A) Bank began operating in Riverton in October 1881 in the building on the corner of Charles Street and Torrens Road, now History Centre & RSL. The current building at 23 Torrens Road was opened in 1915 and became the ANZ Bank in 1970. The premises were sold and leased back to the bank in 1990.



Sadly, the ANZ will close permanently on August 12<sup>th</sup> at 4pm. The ATM, which was installed in 2006, will remain open.

As well as being disappointed to see the Riverton Branch close, it is equally disappointing to say farewell to the friendly faces who have been serving the community for many years.

Agri Manager, Alan Hartwell, has been working in Riverton for 15 years and will continue to work in his current role.

Judy Mullins started working in the bank after leaving school, working for 14 years before leaving to have a family. Since returning to work, Judy has 'clocked up' another 24 years. That's quite an achievement!

Lyn Bruce has worked for the bank for 28 years, the last 13 at Riverton.

Both Judy & Lyn are planning to be 'ladies of leisure' and rest for a while before considering other options.

Vicki Schulz makes up the team. Vicki began working in Riverton 11 years ago, initially as a casual employee before being made permanent part time, working between Riverton & Clare.

The Riverton community has been well served by Alan, Judy, Lyn & Vicki over many years. On behalf of the community, TLR would like to thank them for their service and wish them all the best for the future.

The ANZ has requested the footprint only for the ATM to remain after April 2021, and this may help attract a new business to the premises. The ANZ Bank lease is until April 2021 unless new tenants can be found, in which case ANZ will allow the lease agreement to be broken.

The owner of the building is offering 6 months free rent to new tenants on a 3 year plus 1 agreement.

Stanley Germain also watchmaker, in 1935. Harold Shephard ran both a newsagency & barber's shop when he purchased the building in 1957. Subsequent newsagents have been Paul & Carol Clements, Stewart & Sandra Twigden, Michael & Catherine Sandland. Bruce Tomlinson & Sharon Reichelt and finally, Helen & Tubby Taylor.

# Information about the Clare and Gilbert Valleys Council 20/21 Annual Business Plan and Budget

#### What's happened around town lately?

Anyone driving and walking around Riverton in the last few months will have seen lots of activity going on in Riverton: Bitumen roadworks in Gilbert Street and Railway Tce. Footpath and kerbing works in Frederick Place, Masters, Oxford, Paul, Swinden and Gilbert Streets. Road re-sheeting of Ettrick, Gants Hill, Hester, Leeward, Bruce and Ryelands Roads. There were a few small footpath and kerbing jobs done – Torrens Road, Washington Road, Gilbert Street. Some culverts repaired. Some new trees planted.





There were two fantastic projects. One was the new kerbing and footpaths for Moorhouse Tce from Torrens Road to the hospital. The other was the construction of footpaths, kerbing and road sealing of Moorhouse Lane. I encourage you to visit Moorhouse Lane to see the fantastic job done in what was previously a very sorry situation for residents for many years.

The Riverton Transfer Station has been constructed and will be opening soon (September-ish).

There has been new and upgrades of facilities for the Riverton Caravan Park and Recreation Grounds, and renewal of the Community Wastewater Management system pump station. The Riverton War Memorial Swimming Pool, Riverton History Centre, Riverton Library, Riverton Caravan Park, Riverton Recreation Grounds, the Rattler Trail, town buildings (including the Town Hall, RSL and Doctors House) have been supported.



Community wellbeing projects have been a strong focus, such as a Beyondblue Mental Health Awareness Event, Youth Development Officer, the Star Club Officer as well as the Christmas and Australia Day events. The Open Space and Recreation Strategy was completed. Our peak body, the RCMC received ongoing support and a Community Asset Grant funded row markers at the Riverton Cemetery.

#### Recovering from drought and covid-19

Council was fortunate to receive two rounds of Drought Communities Funding. For Riverton, funding to assist our economic recovery was directed to local employment in maintaining the Town Hall and RSL Buildings. Soon you will see new adult outdoor gym equipment in the Recreation Ground, which is an exciting project being organised by RCMC.

The Elected Members are acutely aware of the significant issues facing our community as we slowly emerge from the COVID-19 Health Emergency. Some Councils are helping through a rate relief program.

The Clare and Gilbert Valleys Council's focus is directed towards complementing national and state government initiatives at the local level. Significantly, our Council has executed an assistance package for those sectors of the economy that have been specifically and significantly impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

This assistance involves a range of relief packages which were implemented for eligible businesses and individuals, including grants and rate relief for the fourth quarter of general rates and all service charges (if applicable). Support grants are available for sporting clubs. In addition, rate relief was available for residential ratepayers who had lost their job because of the COVID-19 Health Emergency.

In addition to the above, an amount of \$300,000 has been set aside in the 2020/21 Council budget for a post emergency economic stimulus program. This essentially represents what a 2.9% general rate increase is being used for: as each 1% represents \$100,000. You should note in the Annual Business Plan page 24 that, considering an increase in valuations, the primary production rate increase is only 2.4% (not 5% as quoted by some). #### What is in store for next few months?

The Clare and Gilbert Valleys Council's 20/21 Annual Business Plan summarises the services, programs and projects that Council proposes to deliver in the forthcoming year. You can see there is a continued focus on essential services such as roads, footpaths, stormwater, drainage and wastewater management and continued support in the areas of health, buildings and planning. Managing Council's statutory responsibilities in health, building and planning assessment will continue. The Community Wastewater Management System will get some more upgrades and there will be a new Niche Wall built at the Riverton Cemetery.

Some special projects in the next few months include the implementation of a *Tourism Experiences Roadmap* where we will see enhancements to the Rattler Trail. A little bit down the road at Tarlee we will see a huge re-vamp of the Information Bay –new signage, street furniture, landscaping and public art. Council is in the midst of developing a Disability Access and Inclusion Plan.

#### Council consulting you on issues

There has been a lot of conversation in the community about a plan to sell key community buildings.

A Council principle is that people have a right to be informed about issues affecting their area and their lives, and to influence Council's decisions. I'd like to reassure you that there has been no discussion by Council about this matter to date. No decisions will be made without inclusive consultation with the community.

#### Staying informed

- Council Facebook on 17 June, 24 June, 6 July
- Council website with links to documents and the "LetsTalk" forum
- There were a few "shares" on various social media forums, including 'Riverton Community' facebook.
- Thanks to Gaynor and Sheron who hand delivered copies of the draft documents to some Riverton businesses and residents.
