
## Digital Information Board Survey – Your Opinion Counts!!

For all small communities, one of the main concerns is the ability to provide current and relevant information to its residents. It seems that the many forms of communication available i.e. newspapers, flyers, post and social media still leave people being unaware of events of significance.

In an attempt to provide a solution to this gap, Riverton Community Management Committee (RCMC) is proposing to install a Digital Information Board in the Main Street in a prominent location. We value our Community's opinion and, in order to gain your input, RCMC is circulating a survey requesting information from the residents of Riverton and surrounds to enable us to gain community opinion as to the viability of this Digital Information Board. The survey is confidential and your name is not required. To date we have over 90 replies which is fantastic.

We have been investigating different scenarios and above is a design which may be considered if this project is successful. Another option would be smaller digital boards which may be placed on existing buildings in multiple locations along the road.

If our Community believe that this project is a worthwhile initiative, we will need to apply for grants in order for the project to become a reality.

## RHYNIE PEAK BODY FACES CLOSURE.

The Rhynie Improvement Scheme has been in existence for over 30 years. It was formed by residents of the community who wanted to enhance the features of the town, particularly the Parking Bay. They raised funds, primarily through catering and an annual "scrub roast", and used those funds to build the public toilets, a shelter, table and chairs, and established the rose garden and playground. More recently, using Peak Body Funding and Grants we installed an electric BBQ and



paved the shelter, provided murals at the Parking Bay and Tennis Shed, as well as laying named pavers around the Tennis Shed, replaced the barrier fence around the playground with recycled plastic material. Our most significant project was to clean out and widen the Woolshed Flat Creek, which proved very valuable during the heavy rains late last year.



Unfortunately most of the residents who drove these projects have left the area, passed away, or are no longer capable of community activities. The small number of current committee members does not meet constitutional requirements, which means we cannot continue to operate as we do not have a proper representation from the community.

I have scheduled a "Special General Meeting" for Tuesday 13<sup>th</sup> June, 2023 at 7.30 pm in the CFS Meeting Room, to decide if we can continue or not. If you are able, please attend to have your say on this important decision.
