

Vale Eddie Pearce



On the 15th April 2024 I was honoured to attend the funeral of Eddie Pearce, representing the Riverton RSL Sub Branch. Eddie was the last surviving WW2 veteran from our Sub Branch. A eulogy was presented by his cousin, Don Bursill, who outlined his life. Despite having a difficult start to life. Eddie lived a full and productive life successful farmer as а businessman across the state, and was well respected by those he came in contact with. In WW2 he enlisted into the Army, tragically, at that time, his three elder brothers, who were already in the army, were listed as 'killed in action'. The government policy at the time dictated that he could not be posted to overseas service, so Eddie served his time in northern parts of Australia.

A eulogy was also presented by Allison Freer on behalf of the Walara Gilbert Valley Homes, where he spent his latter years. Clearly, he was well liked and respected by staff and the residents of the homes.

However, Eddie never lost his larrakin spirit, as Allison recalled the exploits of the "Three Amigos", Eddie Pearce, Clyde Atkins and Ross Schultz, usually on their gophers in Riverton.

Eddie's WW2 uniform is on loan to the RSL and is proudly on display in our museum.

RSL K9 Project

Members of the Riverton RSL and the Lions Club of Gilbert Valley gathered recently at RSL House to hear a presentation by the Royal Society for the Blind representative, Wendy Lucas on the Operation K9 veteran support dog project.

Both the RSL and Lions have agreed to raise funds to complement the efforts of 'Ronnie' McInerney and the Riverton Swimming Club who started fundraising earlier this year.

"The benefit of a trained support dog to the veteran suffering from PTSD is incredible," Wendy explained. There are veterans who could not manage going to their post box in the front of their house but are now able, with a support of their dog, to go for walks and visit friends. Some recipients have been able to have their medications reduced and have been able to live a normal life again.

It is hoped that \$2000 can be raised by the end of June.

GILBERT VALLEY SOCIAL GROUP VISITS MONARTO ZOO


Thirty-five people undertook a trip to Monarto Zoo on Tuesday 4th June, leaving Riverton at 9am.

Short History of Rhynie CFS up to 4th August 1991

The early days of fire fighting equipment in Rhynie consisted of several 44 gallon drums of water and a hand operated pump, which was stored on a stand adjacent to the Rhynie School. I have been told that in the event of a fire the pump and drums would be loaded onto a local farmer's truck or utility. Back in the 1940's, a local identity, Jock Keenan, resided next to the school and operated a carrying and fuel business, and his truck was used many times as the Rhynie Fire Truck.

Around 1953/54, a group of Rhynie farmers and residents took it upon themselves to form a committee to try to upgrade the fire fighting equipment in Rhynie. After several meetings it was decided that interested rate payers would each donate 10 pounds, and a two wheeled trailer would be constructed, consisting of a 200 gallon tank coupled to a centrifugal pump and powered by a Cooper motor. This unit proved to be quite

satisfactory and after several years of service the motor became quite unreliable. With the help of Council, this pump and motor were replaced with a Villiers, which is still in operation on the farm of Eugene Willis, Tarlee.

Ratepayers concerned in this project consisted of names like, Kirk, Belling, Jenkins, Uppill, Kemp, Crouch, Bowden, Glynn, Hudson, Plew, and Giles, who were guided by the expertise of Mr Max Wright, who then owned the Rhynie Garage, at which this unit was constructed.

In 1982, another generation of farmers came along and decided to replace this trailer with a Landcruiser 4 x 4 unit, to look after the hills area of Rhynie. After a meeting on 13th July, at the Rhynie Hotel, with our then RO (Regional Officer) Menadue, where he suggested that a small 4 x 4 truck be obtained and suitable body be built to suit our needs. After consultation with Riverton District Council and Regional Office, a 1974 International D1310 4 x 4 was purchased. This truck dismantled and new was а body engineered and fitted out with the help of Gilbert Valley Industries along with many hours of labour by local members. This unit was equipped and fitted with a second hand Robin Pump, which was given to us by Riverton CFS Brigade. The total cost of this unit was approx. \$11,350.00.

After spending many hours building this unit, our members became very attached to our lovable Inter Fire Unit, but progress seemed to be heading our way, and it seemed that we were about to replace our truck, after seven years of service to our local community.

As the CFS has now implemented a truck replacement program, our Inter unit has now been replaced by the new Hino 2 x 4 fire unit. I am sure that our members are justly proud of this unit as they were of our last truck, and will look forward to protecting our community with this new truck.

Greetings readers!

It is a pleasure that we provide an update on the Walara Gilbert Valley Redevelopment. This week 2 of the redeveloped rooms again became available for use, making a total of 7 rooms redeveloped and occupied.

A further 5 rooms have been totally demolished internally and external footings being poured for expanded verandahs (refer below).

By the end of May 2024 \$2M of the \$6M redevelopment will have been spent with the next couple of months seeing the construction of the 4 new external rooms and completion of the 5 rooms mentioned above.



We are excited by the community interest and demand for the rooms which are being filled as soon as they are redeveloped, and we have a waiting list for the new rooms being constructed.

The recruitment of International Nurses is continuing across all Walara sites and we anticipate the arrival of the next Registered Nurse in the coming weeks.

Across the other Walara sites I am able to report the completion of the Walara Hamley Bridge \$3.5M redevelopment with all 52 rooms now occupied.



In Balaklava we have secured an additional \$1.8M grant to construct staff accommodation. This is timely with the extreme shortage of residential accommodation in our region.

The Scholz Park Committee was thrilled to receive a donation of a Drover's Wagon from Bill Marshall on behalf of the Marshall Family.

The wagon has been in the Marshall family since 1954. It has travelled numerous back roads throughout the Mid North, Riverland and Yorke Peninsula, bringing mobs of sheep down from Orroroo, Peterborough, Jamestown and many more.

Norman Marshall would have 1,500 to 2,000 sheep on the road at a time with some jobs lasting three, six or nine months depending on feed and water. It was last used in 1988 to bring 1,000 sheep down from Peterborough for the Bicentenary.

Bill Marshall has spent the last 4-5 months rejuvenating the old wagon so that it can be placed on display in our museum.

Our thanks and appreciation go to him and his brother, Peter, for their efforts.
