The Riverton Primary School P & F raised





approximately 1,000.00 from food, the proceeds of which will go toward projects they have earmarked for the school. Students from the primary school's Nature Club exhibited their talents (see separate article).

An additional \$1,000.00 was raised from stall holders' fees and a raffle, and those proceeds will be donated to the Walara Gilbert Valley Senior Citizen's Home in Riverton.

The Edithburgh Spinners and Weavers made the trek to Riverton and provided demonstrations of their skills along with a display of their talents. Others who travelled from far and wide included a Jamaican artist from Cape Jervis, a 'creams and remedy

Residents, hearing this siren operating continuously, are advised to go to the CFS website or tune into the ABC on radio in order to receive information about the emergency at hand.

The siren will be tested on the first Saturday morning of each month, between 8.30 and 9.00am, beginning Saturday 1st September 2024. The test will be in the form of 3 short bursts, and residents do not need to respond to any of the tests.

A continuous siren ONLY will be the signal to take action.

Service Planning Update: Burra, Riverton, and Snowtown Hospitals

What's Happening?

In December 2023, a steering group began codesigning a Service Plan for Burra Hospital, Riverton District Soldiers' Memorial Hospital, and Snowtown Memorial Hospital. This group has been meeting monthly and has considered population statistics, service usage, and feedback from local clinicians, service providers, and community members. The goal is to develop future service models that benefit these communities. It is envisaged the plan will be ready for endorsement in the coming months.

Community Engagement

The steering group extends their sincere thanks to all residents, community members, consumers, clinicians, staff and stakeholders who took the time to participate in the community engagement process and provide input about hospital, Community and Allied Health Services and mental health services in Burra, Riverton, and Snowtown.

We used various methods to collect feedback on current services, challenges, and opportunities to guide future service directions. We informed the community and key partners about how they could be involved, using newsletter articles, targeted Facebook posts, and flyers.

The engagement opportunities included:

Drop-in sessions and "Have Your Say" events in Burra, Riverton, and Snowtown.

Consumer interviews.

Electronic and hard copy surveys available for six weeks, with survey return boxes in local pharmacies, supermarkets, hospitals, and medical centres.

We received 79 completed surveys (60 electronic and 18 hard copies), and two consumer interviews were conducted based on survey indications of interest.

We had 114 people attend the four "Drop-In and Have Your Say" sessions in Burra, Riverton, and Snowtown.

Clinician Engagement Workshop

On March 20, 2024, 49 clinicians and partners gathered at the Clare Sporting Precinct to discuss future healthcare service needs and opportunities for Burra, Riverton, and Snowtown. The event included hospital and health clinical staff, community health staff, HAC, private aged care providers, Ambulance Service, and a local GP.

Discussions focused on general medical, mental health, aged care, and out-of-hospital strategies. The Steering Group has analysed the gathered information to inform the service planning process.

What We Heard

Here's a summary of the feedback from our communities.

Our Strengths:

Professional, dedicated, and caring staff.
Accessibility and availability of various
services, including hospital, accident and
emergency, GPs, aged care, and community
services.

Next Steps

In June and July 2024, the steering group will complete the draft plan for consideration by YNLHN.

The plan will then be released by YNLHN and available on the <u>YNLHN Website</u>.

Furthermore, we are committed to addressing the healthcare workforce challenges faced by our services. A collaborative effort is essential in developing strategies to overcome workforce shortages and enhance the quality of care provided to our community.

As part of these efforts, we will collaborate with the local doctors, the South Australian Ambulance Service (SAAS), partner agencies, and clinicians to explore a sustainable service model for our health services. This initiative aims to ensure that we have a robust and resilient workforce capable of meeting the care needs of our communities.

Your continued support and collaboration are vital as we progress with these initiatives.

Welcome to the July 2024 Update.

COVID remains in our community and is therefore a timely reminder to all to ensure we remain vigilant in our day-to-day Infection Prevention Control measures including hand hygiene protocols, social distancing and if you are feeling unwell to conduct a RAT and consider alternate visiting arrangements.

As part of Walara's commitment to this community, the Walara Board is pleased to announce the acquisition of Hayfield Plains retirement village in Balaklava from the Church of Christ. This is an important aged care service to our community, strengthening

the bond between home, retirement and residential aged care living.

The Walara website and promotional material will soon be updated to reflect recent redevelopments at Walara Hamley Bridge and Walara Gilbert Valley, along with information about Walara Hayfield Plains. Any enquires can be directed to ceo@walara.au.

The fourth of our International Nurses commences Monday 5 August 2024 and they will work at the Walara Hamley Bridge site adding to the two nurses who work at Walara Balaklava Millcourt and Walara Gilbert Valley.

This remains an important strategy in increasing our own local staff and reducing the number of agency staff currently helping us out.

Redevelopment

The \$6M redevelopment at Walara Gilbert Valley is continuing and the five rooms currently under development on the eastern side should be available by end of July 2024. Construction on the 4 new rooms has also started with frames being erected this week. Photos reflecting recent works are included below.





Walara has been successful in securing a \$1.8M grant to build staff accommodation in Balaklava. This brings the Commonwealth Funding secured in the last 3 years to \$12M to help with the growth and support of aged care initiatives in the 3 townships of Balaklava, Gilbert Valley and Hamley Bridge.

Members held a luncheon recently where everyone brought a plate to share and most of the food was prepared from produce that people had grown in their plot. The idea was an outstanding success and will be repeated later when summer veg is available.

Jingles Garden has recently won grants for over \$10,000 from the Council, Waterloo Windfarm and SA Government Social Impact Fund to replace the outdoor gazebo, do paving and provide outdoor furniture. The emphasis of this project highlights a role of Jingles Garden to support the wellbeing of our community as a meeting place, not only for Jingles members but the community as a

whole.
