Australia Day Celebrations & Riverton Community Awards

Following a decision by Clare & Gilbert Valleys Council to award one set of awards for the whole council area instead of separate awards for the Northern, Central and Southern zones, Riverton Community Management Committee chose this year, for the first time, to implement local community awards.



Approximately 100 people attended the breakfast and the inaugural presentation of the Riverton Community Awards at the Riverton Recreation Grounds on Australia Day, Sunday 26th January. After a delicious breakfast catered for by Gilbert Valley Cricket Club, formalities began with Riley McInerney, CGVC Young Citizen of the Year 2024 (and also coordinator of the breakfast), raising the flag.

MC for the day was Vice Chairperson of Riverton Community Management Committee, Gary Davis. Gary introduced guest Speaker, Scott Haines, who represented CFS. Scott spoke about his personal journey in life which involved various career changes before becoming a member of CFS, both as a volunteer and now as an employee. He emphasised the benefits and rewards of volunteering in the local community.

Councillor, Brian Koch, officiated at the presentation of the awards.



Brian & Margaret Prime were the well deserving recipients of the Community Heroes/ Champions award. Brian & Margaret have for the last 30 years, since they retired to live in Riverton, been extremely active volunteers in the community. This include Meals on Wheels, Scholz Park, Red Cross, visiting residents at both Riverton and District Memorial Hospital and Gilbert Valley Homes, Riverton Voluntary Garden Group and volunteering and providing valued assistance in many other groups and clubs in Riverton.

Brian & Margaret were also major contributors to the recipients of one of the two 'Heart of the Community' (Event/Organisation) award groups, Country Carers (Quilters). Along with Gloria Schulz, Ruth Schoenberg and Bev Schoenberg, the group has been making quilts for the needy for more than 26 years. Over 800 quilts have been produced and donated to charities, Lutheran Community Care, Riverton

Hospital, Gilbert Valley (Walara) Homes and families in need. With several processes required, from designing a quilt, sourcing fabrics to the finished product, this group is certainly deserving of the award for Organisation.



The second 'Heart of the Community' award was for the Makers Market event. Organiser, Tracey Vandepeer, as a representative of the Possum's Nest Craft Group, accepted the award. The Makers Market was held on 28th July 2024. Thirty five stall holders filled the Riverton Community Hall with an array of quality handcrafted goods. As well as local craftspeople, stall holders came from Clare, Edithburgh, Burra Cape Jervis & Carrickalinga.

Riverton Primary School put on a spectacular display of their lunchtime Nature Club crafts. The school's Parents & Friends raised approximately \$1000 from food sales, the proceeds of which going to earmarked projects.

All proceeds from stall holders' fees and a raffle, totalling \$1000, were donated to Walara Gilbert Valley Homes.

Elise Bastian and Erica Parker, students from Riverton Primary School and Riverton High School respectively, received the Riverton Community Award for Exceptional Primary/ High School Student. Elise has demonstrated exceptional dedication to her studies, achieving results above her year level. She has shown leadership and compassion, serving as a peer mentor to younger students at school, participating in other projects, including school singing group as well as volunteering at local events and helping organise charity fundraisers to help families.





Erica was nominated by staff because she is an exceptional student and role model, with leadership skills and academic ability. She has been chairperson and secretary of the School's Student Representative Council most of her school life, organising SRC events, including the "Push Up' Challenge over the last two years, raising funds for mental health, a disco for junior students and working in the canteen at lunchtimes.


