Christmas Celebrations

I am pleased to announce on **Friday 19 December** there will be a Parade through Riverton followed by a Christmas Carnival at the town oval. Thank you to Jodie and Tamra who offered to help out this year with the organising. Over the past few weeks, the three of us have been working hard to organise something magical for the community to enjoy. There will be some changes to what has occurred in recent years, with the intention to keep it simple and bring back the fun activities and games for the kids to enjoy.

To view the parade, you will need to be positioned at a location along the designated route. Once the parade has passed by, everyone is welcome to go to the town oval for a free sausage sizzle, Christmas music and heaps of fun activities for the kids to do.

Due to new Traffic Management Legislation Riverton's annual Christmas Parade cannot travel along the traditional route. Rolling road closures are no longer permitted and Highways and DIT roads are not able to be closed at all. This year, and possibly for future years, the parade will assemble on Strickland Street and progress from there along a slightly modified route.

All roads along the route will be closed from about 5:00pm - 7:00pm, and will only be accessible to the residents who live on those roads. However, once the parade passes by residents can resume their regular activities.

We are asking for your understanding and cooperation. On the day of the parade from 5:00pm it would be very helpful for no vehicles to be parked along the designated route.



There is no official committee to keep organising the Christmas celebrations in Riverton. It would be great to see a few people put their hand up and be a part of making Christmas magical for 2026.

Horrocks Highway Culvert Upgrade

Finishing works to upgrade an existing culvert on the Horrocks Highway, approximately 2km north of Rhynie, are taking place from Friday 7 November 2025.

Remaining works include the final sealing, removal of the temporary access road, and line-marking.

The upgrade will improve flood resilience, safety and heavy vehicle capacity along this important freight corridor.

To keep everyone safe while we undertake these works, speed and lane restrictions will be in place throughout the area during work hours.

Speed restrictions will remain in place outside of work hours as required. Please plan your travel and follow the directions of traffic controllers and onsite signage.



Communities come Together

Based on your feedback, ElectraNet is shifting the focus of our investigations in NTx South to include new areas to the east of the existing four corridor options, in an effort to minimise impacts to high yield cropping land.

While these corridors were identified through early constraint mapping and refined via stakeholder workshops, community engagement revealed a clear desire for ElectraNet to explore options further east.

So that's what we're doing, with new investigations now underway in areas that may better align with community expectations. This includes early conversations with landholders, traditional owners and local businesses to better understand land use, values and priorities.

We want to be clear: no Preferred Corridor has been selected for NTx South at this time and, with additional investigations now underway, a final decision is not expected till early-mid 2026.

Instead, we're taking the time to investigate options thoroughly and respectfully. This is about getting it right, with community input and technical evidence being considered and used to shape the best possible outcome for the region.

We want the community to know that you have been heard!

This change in focus allows us to consider new options to minimise impacts while still delivering the future electricity infrastructure South Australia needs. Every voice we hear helps us make better decisions.

What's next?

A draft What We Heard report is currently being prepared, which will summarise key engagement themes and explain how your feedback is guiding

our decisions. We'll be inviting a final round of input on the draft report to ensure we've captured all perspectives before publishing the final version. A virtual community forum will also be scheduled in early 2026, where you'll have the chance to hear more about what's been learned and question the project team directly.

In other news...

To ensure the NTx project is designed to deliver the best and most cost-effective solution for all South Australians, we have sought a six-month extension from the Australian Energy Regulator (AER) to publish our Project Assessment Draft Report (PADR) in mid-2026, allowing more time for us to thoroughly explore all project options, including new land in the east.

A message from our team:

We know this project has raised uncertainty and that early investigations in the Mid North may have caused concern for some households and communities.

We want to thank everyone who took the time to meet with us, attend sessions and share their views. Your input has made a real difference and will continue to shape how the project moves forward.

Our aim remains to deliver a transmission line that provides long-term benefits while minimising impacts on the people, businesses and places that make this region unique.




